CHART 1. Jones and Cocke Families of Petersburg, Formerly "Wood", VA

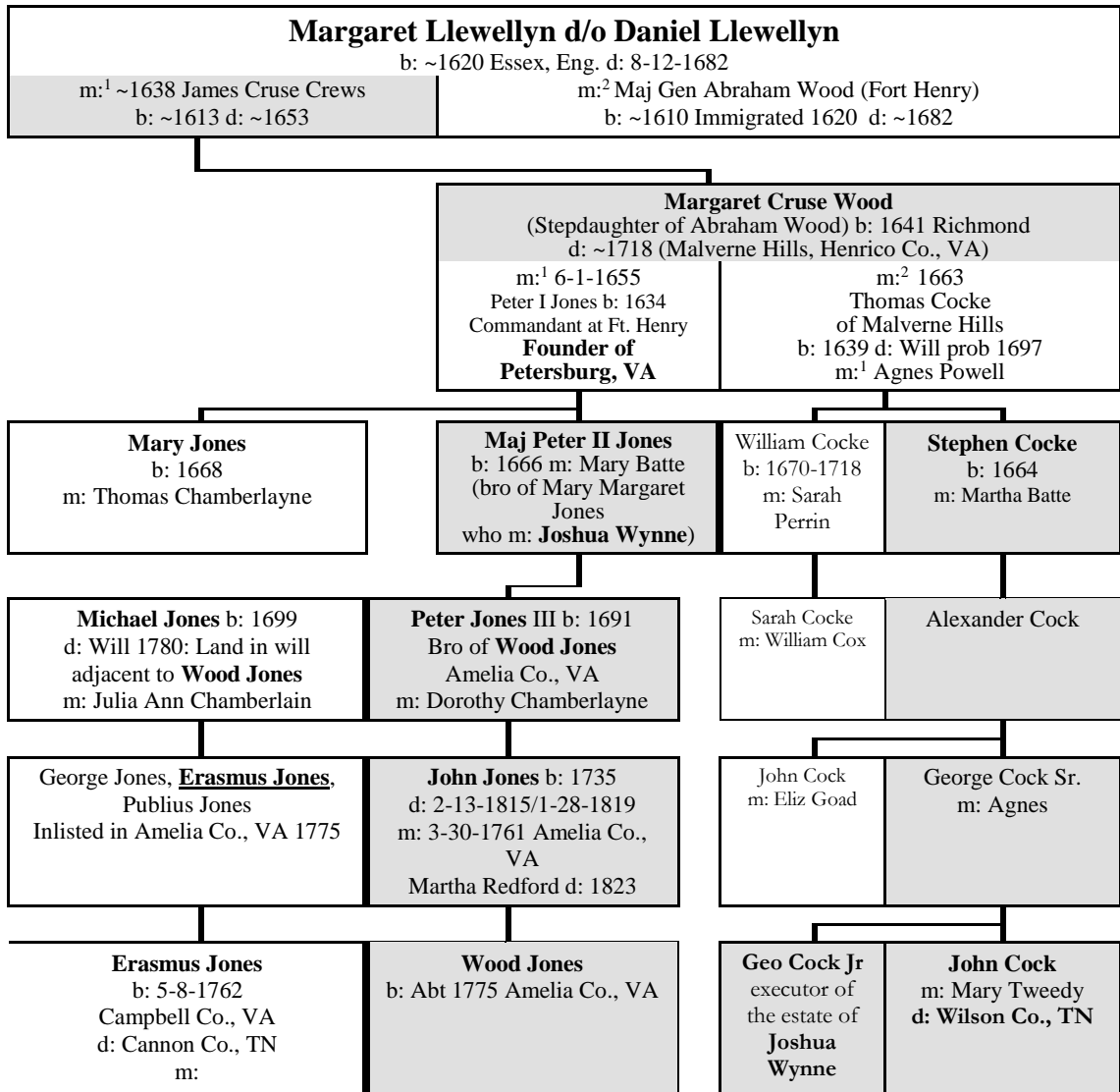
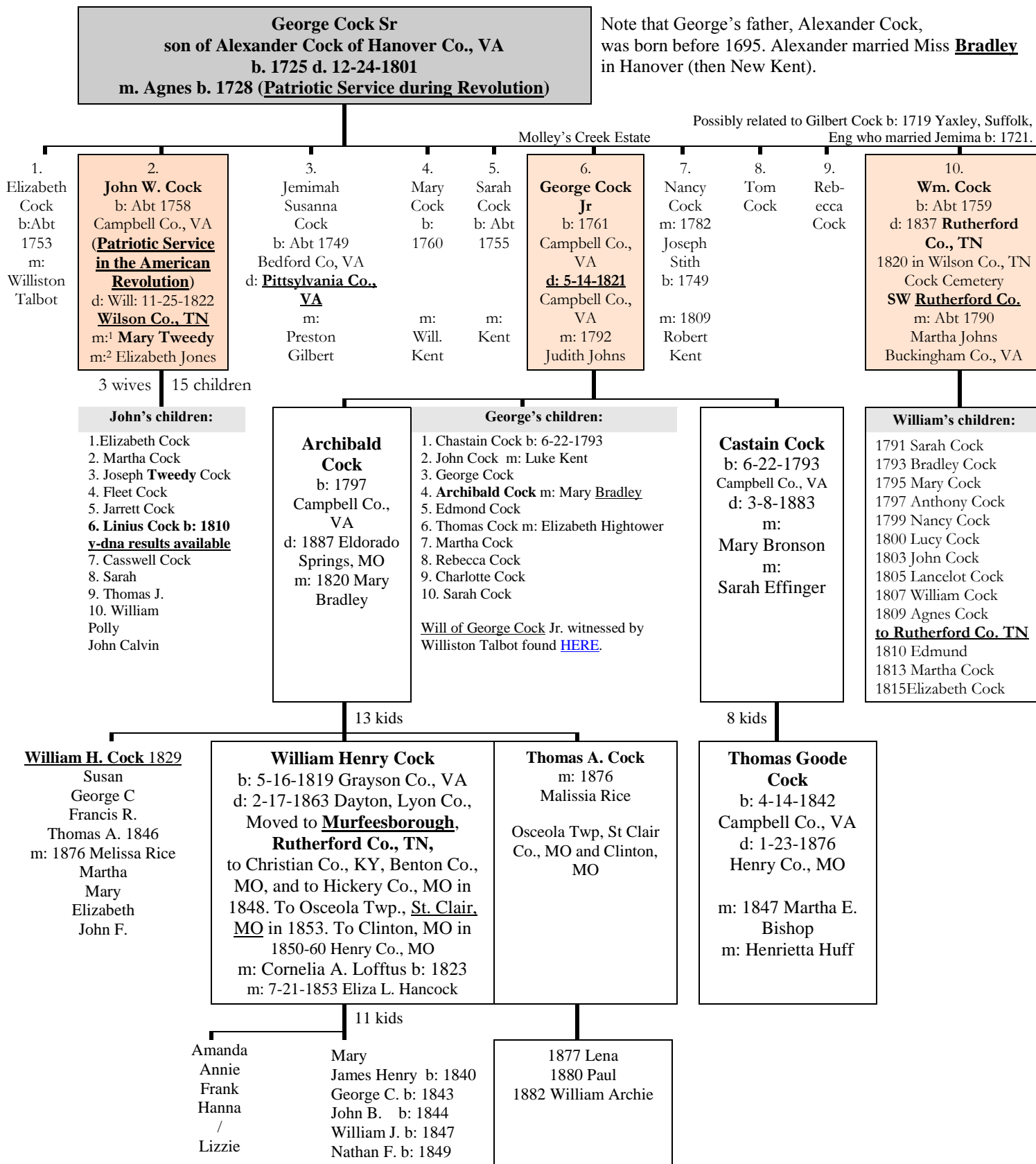


CHART 2. John Cock and Mary Tweedy NOT Parents of Littleberry's Cox



Many have confused John W. Cock born 1758 with Littleberry's father John Cox, born 1740.

Why? It was John Cock and his parents, George and Agnes, who did patriotic Service during the Revolution. (*William and Mary College*, Vol. VIII, Series II, 1928, Pp 122, 123.) (*The Virginia Magazine of History and Biology*, Vol. V Pp. 257, 261 and 262.) (Campbell Co. Courthouse Order Book 1, p 29.) Moreover, the will of Littleberry's father was dated may 22, 1821, and John Cock lived only about three miles away from Littleberry, on Molley's (alias Briery) Creek, in Campbell County, VA.

Likewise, the **y-dna of Linius Cock b: 1810, (nephew of William Cock b: 1759) does not match the descendants of Littleberry Cox** (ysearch.org).

1. The following links offer final proof that the George Cock/John Cock family line is not related to Littleberry and James Cox. The two families just happened to live about three miles apart and just happened to contribute supplies for the Revolution at the same time and appeared for reimbursement on the same day after the war. This is merely circumstantial evidence that they knew each other. The y-dna of Linius Cock does not match the y-dna of Littleberry Cox.

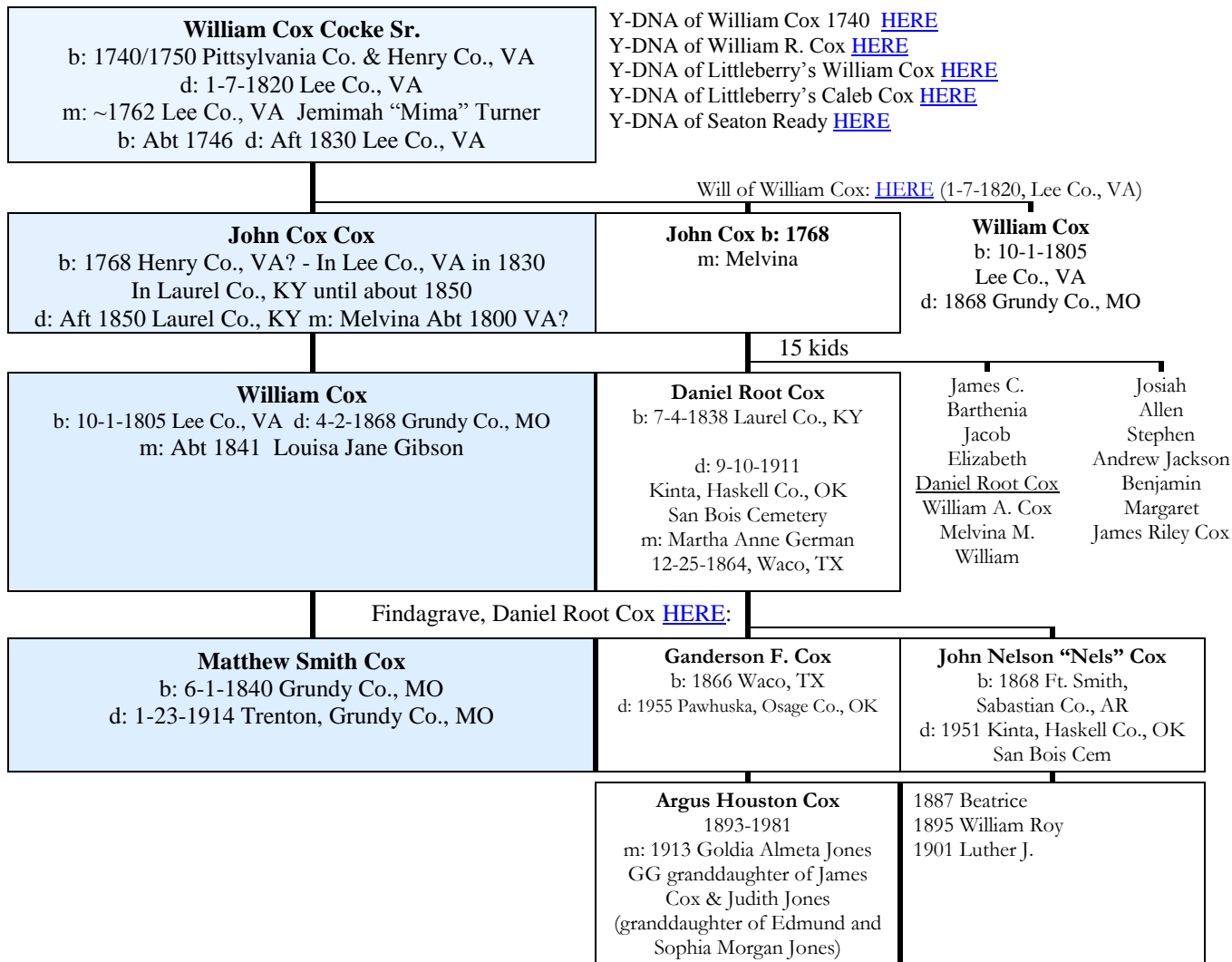
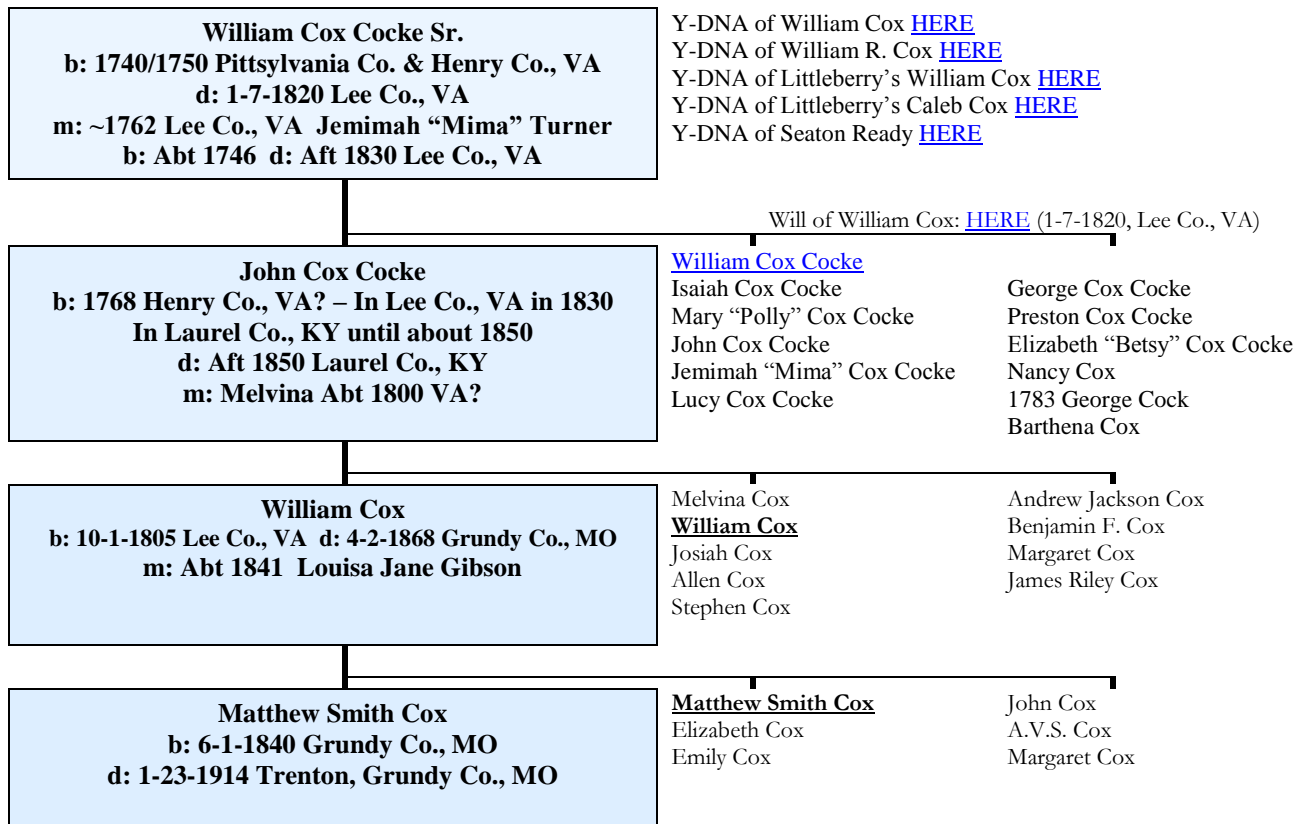

In the will of Michael Jones, he gives land to his son-in-law, Samuel Leason, which is adjacent to Wood Jones and (Joshua?) Morris. Wood Jones & Stephen Cocke are direct decendants of Margaret Wood.

Margaret Wood’s will of 8-12-1817 does not refer to her Cocke children or stepchildren. Assets go to the Jones/Wynne/Randolph side (children of Peter Jones). From 1796-1817, Wood Jones was in Mecklenburg Co., on the south side of the Meherrin River. Also beware of some claiming Michael Jones’ parents were Robert Jones (b: 1678) and Sarah Cleggett m: 3-21-1647, Hingham, MA. No such marriage has been found there, and the paper trail allegedly leads to the Mayflower and England. Michael Jones, Peter Jones and Littleberry Cox were of Welsh descent.

William Cocke, brother of George Jr and John “Jack” Cock”, is buried in the Cocke Cemetery, Rutherford Co., TN (Adjacent to Wilson & Cannon Co., TN), one mile NE of the Thompson Road junction with Hwy 99, 500 ft out in a field.

Property Lines within St. Paul’s Parish, Hanover Co., VA:

1711: Precinct included Alexander Cock & Thomas Bradley (who d: Before 1716).

1731: A line between Alexander Cock & Col. William Byrd, Esq.

1759: Line between Charles Jones (& John Jones?) & William Cock (John Cock present).

(1689: A William Cock witnessed John Jones’ complaint in Westmoreland Co., VA.

1763: A line between Charles Jones & John Wingfield, deceased, & Charles Jones & William Cock.

The line of John Wingfield (George Cock present). The line of John Cock (John Wingfield & George Cock present).

The line between Bradley Cock & John Cock (John Wingfield & George Cock present).

1767: A line between John Wingfield, John Cock & William Cock, deceased. William Cock (Jr.?) present. A line between Harden Burnley & Bradley Cock.

DAR has accepted George Cock, Sr. and Agnes of Campbell Co., VA as the grandparents of Littleberry Cox. Like Littleberry’s parents, John and Polly Cox, they (George & Agnes) did patriotic service during the Revolution. Like Littleberry Cox’s brothers, they (George and Agnes) had a son, John Cock, who moved from Campbell Co., VA, to Wilson Co., TN, and wrote his will in 1822, one year after the death of Littleberry’s father, John Cox, in 1821.

Littleberry’s father, John, died in 1821. But Littleberry’s y-dna is **J2**, and John Cock, likely a brother of George Cock Sr., is **N1c1**. Claibourn Cox (1791) & Valentine Cox are R1b1; therefore, William Cox (the 1610 immigrant) is R1b1 (refer to previous chart on Cock families of Hanover County).

If one son is haplo N1c1, then all four are N1c1. The name is consistently spelled as Cock, not Cox.

Therefore, Y-dna tests indicate that George Cock, Sr. is not the grandfather of Littleberry Cox.
